Car Parking

There have been a number of concerns again recently regarding parking near to the school. A county highways school safety team officer has been out to look at the situation and agreed the school has safe procedures in place. However, for the safety of everyone using the site please be aware of the following:

- Do park on the road and not pavements, as this obstructs pedestrians and could lead to a child being injured by the vehicle mounting the curb
- Do park on the sensibly and not within 10 metres of a bend (this is part of the highway code and an offence if one does so)
- Keep the access to School Lane clear and do not obstruct the bus from leaving the site
- Do drive slowly and carefully when approaching and leaving the school
- Do move to the road side of the pavement when passing the children walking to the bus
- Do respect our neighbours by not obstructing driveways and entrances to property
- Do park away from the school site and walk if possible
