




Peek at the Week

Friday 12th May

What a lovely week we have had in Waveney Class. We have been learning about growing vegetables and our theme book for this week



has been *Oliver's Vegetables* by Alison Bartlett and Vivian French. Thank you for sending in vegetables - we had fun exploring the look, smell, texture and taste, especially when we made vegetable soup. Some of us sequenced pictures of how we made it and wrote captions to go with the photographs. The Reception children compared the mass of vegetables to put them in order from heavy to light and made

a bar graph of our favourite vegetables and doubled quantities of vegetables to make soup for two people. The Nursery children sorted items by colour and size and made pictures by following instructions with positional language. We looked at pictures from the story and wrote in speech bubbles what we thought the characters were saying. We have drawn and painted vegetables and used them for printing. The Reception children looked at artworks by Guiseppe Arcimboldo, identifying which vegetables he used in them and painting our own vegetable faces.
