What a lovely week Waveney class have had. We have finished writing our bean diaries and have planted our beans in soil. We measured the beanstalks in centimetres using ruler and tape measures. Reception made a story book about Carly the Carrot and Nursery have been working on pre-handwriting skills and recognising letters. Some of us have been spelling words with two syllables and Reception have been matching capital letters with the lower case letter. In maths, Reception have been dividing numbers into tens and units and problem solving by grouping and counting in twos, fives and tens. A few of us even worked with hundreds, tens and units. The Reception children looked at clock faces and used them to tell the time. The Nursery children have been working on naming and describing 2D shapes, counting and adding one more. There has been lots of sand and water play outside, solving problems using tubes and guttering. We have made models using junk materials, construction kits and Multilink cubes (copying plans of models). In PE we listened to music and skipped in time to it.
