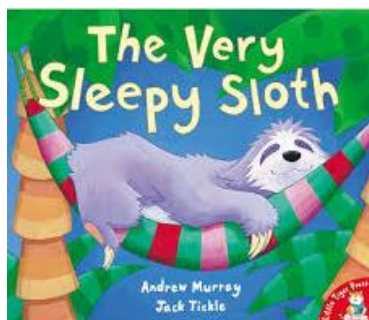




# Peek at the Week

Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> March



We have had a lovely and very busy week in Waveney class. We are continuing to talk about hot places, this week learning about a rainforest animal - the sloth. We listened to the stories *The Very Sleepy Sloth* by Andrew Murray and Jack Tickle and *Slowly, Slowly Said the Sloth* by Eric Carle.



We also watched some video footage of sloths in a sanctuary in South America, observing their movements and eating habits. We wrote in speech bubbles what we thought the sloth was saying and wrote facts about sloths. We made collage pictures of sloths and used them for an addition and subtraction activity. Lots of us also made sloth toys using socks and felt and we painted rainforest animals. We have continued to learn about doubling numbers and we also learnt that sloths move very slowly so we used timers to see what we could do in 5 minutes. We were much faster than sloths!
