




Peek at the Week

Friday 10th May



We have had a really busy week in Waveney Class. The children have enjoyed learning about how plants grow using our focus book *The Tiny Seed* by Eric Carle. We have been looking at different kinds of plants and they named the parts of flowering plants. We talked about what plants need to grow and related it to weather. We noticed that on some flowers the leaves grow in pairs so they drew leaves on stems and numbered them in pairs to 10 or 20. Some of the children were

able to work out which row of numbers is odd and which is even. The Reception children have looked carefully at different types of flowers and drew them using a variety of media, such as graphite sticks, oil pastels and watercolours. Nursery made flowers that are the same size as each of the children and some of them can name the stem, leaves and petals. We used a variety of materials, including paper, rice and pasta to create flower pictures and we also made and decorated salt dough flowers. We have looked at the work of the artist Hundertwasser and made our own versions of his paintings. Some children made a flower shop outside and enjoyed selling plants and pots to their friends.
