



Peek at the Week

Tuesday 26th May

Waveney Class have come to the end of their learning on the theme of transport. We have been very pleased and impressed with all the lovely activities we have seen on Tapestry. Well done Waveney class. You are all superstars!



Last week's Star of the Week was Martha Mortimer, who has worked very hard on lots of activities. Well done, Martha.

The staff have been working hard to prepare the environment for those children who will be returning to school on 1st June. We deliberated long and hard over groupings and staffing and we have set up three 'bubble' groups. Each group will be named after a popular book character and the first week we will plan activities for each group focussed on their character.



Mrs Leport's group is Elmer. The teaching of this group will be shared between Mrs Leport (Mon Tues Wed) and Miss Hall. The Elmers will be Bentley, Ella, Emily B, Isaac.



Mrs East's group is Paddington. The teaching of this group will be shared between Mrs East (Thurs Fri), Mrs Stansfield and Miss Hall. The Paddingtons will be Amy, Sophia, Harriet and Arthur E.



Mrs Bishop's group is Supertato. Mrs Bishop will teach this group. The Supertatos will be India, Martha, Arthur S, and Harry.

The groups will rotate between three teaching areas. Each group will have their own set of basic equipment, which will be washed after use and will be taken to whichever teaching area the group is in for that session. Other equipment specific to an area will be cleaned at lunchtimes and at the end of the day, so that it is clean for each new group.

We would prefer it if the children wore trainers to school as much of the day may be spent outside, some of it on the grass or the field, so the children will not need to keep changing footwear.

They will need to bring their reading folder with just their school reading books inside; a water bottle, a coat and a sunhat. (Please apply sun-cream at home in the morning.) If your child has sore hands because of the additional washing, they can keep a little tube of named hand cream in their tray.

The nursery room will be our literacy room. Outside the willow shelter and mud kitchen area will also be used.



The activity area will be for maths and physical / construction activities. The children will also use the grassy area and hut for maths and construction outdoors.



The outside work station will focus on art, craft and messy play.



Each group will be taught in their 'bubble' group. The children may join together for story times and playtimes when we can do this outdoors, in order to provide plenty of space for this to take place safely. We understand that the children have missed their friends terribly, but it would help us greatly if you could explain to your child that they will not be able to hold hands with or hug their friends at the moment.

When the children arrive in the mornings, they will go with their teacher, one group at a time, to the area where they will do that morning's activities, washing their hands as they enter the building. We would like parents to line up on the green dots nearest the fence and when they reach the front of the line, say goodbye to their child at the gate then peel off back through the playground close to the building, following the one-way system.



At the end of the day we will bring the children to the playground and hand them over in the order that the parents are lining up on the arrows. As before, could you follow the one way system to leave the school site.



Here are some messages from the children to their friends.
