As a member of staff she was always ready with an encouraging word and a smile. She formed a special bond in particular with many of our most vulnerable children and had a gift for diffusing a situation and making people smile. She will be much missed by both the children and us, her colleagues and friends.

As a staff and community, I'm sure you will join with me in sending our deepest sympathies and condolences to Mick and the children.

On Thursday morning, we will be holding a special memorial assembly in school that will be led by the Reverend Gini. This will be our opportunity for all the staff and children to celebrate Mrs Tyas' life.
