LEARNING CHARACTER OF THE WEEK:

THE CHANGING CHAMELEON



The Changing Chameleon loves to learn and has a sense of herself as a learner. She knows she can get better at things over time, that she can set goals for herself and that she will get there in the end. This learning dimension is called 'Changing and Learning' The opposite of this dimension is being 'stuck,' or demotivated and believing that learning power is 'fixed.' Successful learners instead are self-aware: they understand that we all change and adapt all the time, and that everything they do is a lesson learned. The Changing Chameleon shows us how to make sense of our learning by seeing it in a wider context, as part of our life story, or our 'learning journey.'

I'm sure you've noticed the installation of our new Reflective Shed near the school gates. This space will soon be turned into a calm, reflective area where children can take time out to be still and thoughtful. We're grateful to Cllr Hadingham for providing the funding for this project.

The children of Yangtze Class have taken on the challenge of turning the area around the shed into a Sensory Garden. They started by researching the plants and features they would like to include, then they wrote persuasive letters to local businesses to ask for their support.

The children were delighted to receive letters of support and contributions from Surface Solutions East Anglia, Mr Peter Davidson, Central England Co-op, Middleton Nurseries, the Spar in Stradbroke, Cone Tree Nursery and Cam Planning, and they are still hoping to hear back from other businesses too.
