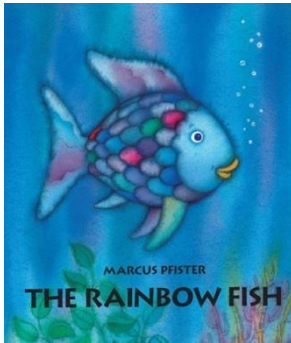




Peek at the Week

Friday 25th June



We have had a really busy week in Waveney Class. Our theme book for this week has been *The Rainbow Fish* by Marcus Pfister. We read the story and answered questions about the text. We discussed how we can be kind to other people and wrote some ideas in a speech bubble. We talked about our



prized possessions and how we would feel if we lost them or shared them.

We brainstormed a list of all the sea creatures we know then chose one to draw and paint with rainbow colours. We also used bubble wrap to print fish scales on two fish shapes and stuffed them to make them 3D. We explored shiny and not shiny objects, making a collection, and learnt the word dull.

In Maths we subtracted from numbers to 20, using the language 1 less than 20 is..., etc., using shiny scales on a Rainbow Fish picture. We chose a number between 10 and 20 and used beads on two fish to find as many number bonds as we could.

Thank you to the parents who came in to help with the special art days on Monday and Tuesday led by Art Solutions. Nursery created a wonderful waterfall. Reception made a super snake, tremendous tapirs and a terrific tree. The atrium is now full of colourful rainforest animals.

We also had great fun learning to ride scooters in the special scooter event. Some of us even learnt to do tricks on the scooter!

You could write them on the ground in chalk and ask your child to read them as they jump from word to word or squirt water at them.
