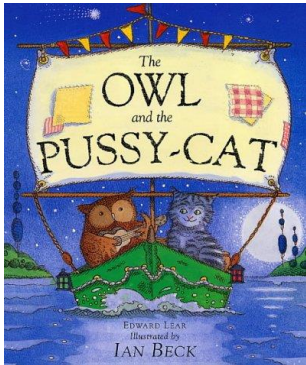




Peek at the Week

Friday 2nd July



We have continued our sea theme by using the poem *The Owl and the Pussycat* as our focus this week. We listened to the poem and drew the owl and pussycat's journey, annotating the features. The children were given a list of words from the poem and they had to write words that rhymed with their words.

On Thursday we learnt about weddings in the Christian faith and some children talked about weddings they had been to. We looked at lots of the teachers' wedding photos. Then we worked together to make wedding cakes. We made decorations, cards, bunting and some of us designed wedding dresses.



On Friday we celebrated the wedding of Sol and India. Oliver asked to be the vicar because his uncle is a vicar. There were beautiful bridesmaids, a best man who did a good job of looking after the ring, very smart guests who all brought a wrapped gift, an excellent chauffeur who drove the wedding car and two super bell ringers, who made their own bells. In Maths, some of us made two tiered wedding cakes by doubling the amount of Multilink cubes. We revised o'clock and half past times on clocks, and the names and properties of 3D shapes.

We have continued to work on words beginning with two consonants and also some endings, xt and nt.

The Nursery children have been learning about 2D shapes and made fantastic shape biscuits. We welcomed next year's children for their first visit - they all played together very well.
