





# Peek at the Week

Friday 9<sup>th</sup> July



Oliver very kindly lent us his book *The Storm Whale* by Benji Davies for this week's learning. We discussed the story and wrote about how to look after a whale. We designed and labelled a beach house. We talked about who our friends are and how we feel when we don't see them. We also read *The Snail and the Whale* by Julia Donaldson and Axel Scheffler. We noticed that both books had similar events - a storm

and the rescue of a whale from the sand. There were lots of good ideas about how to move a whale back into the sea.



On Wednesday we had a visit from storyteller Hannah from Tiny Tales Storytellers. It was a wonderful experience for all the children. (There is a separate report on the website).

In Maths, we made repeating patterns using different types of shells or we used squared paper to create a pattern on a sea creature shape. We practised making number bonds of 10 or 20. We also measured shells in a variety of ways (using balancing scales and rulers).

In PE we practised our skipping skills.
