



Peek at the Week

Friday 15th October

We have had a very busy week in Waveney Class. Our theme story this week was The Ugly Duckling. We listened to the story, then drew and labelled our favourite part. We sequenced events in the story by drawing two, three, four or five pictures and saying what happened 'after that'. We learned about the life cycle of a swan and some children put the pictures in order. Some children knew that a baby sawn is called a cygnet. We watched some

videos of swans and cygnets swimming on a river and described the Ugly Duckling,

who was a cygnet, and a swan. Some of us wrote or copied initial letter sounds and some of us wrote or copied the dominant sounds by segmenting. We watched clips of The Dance of the Cygnets from the Swan Lake ballet and the children copied some of the movements in small groups.

We talked about emotions we might feel in various situations and used mirrors to look at how our faces look when we are feeling them.

We have been pulling our best happy, sad, excited and cross faces, then talking about why we might be feeling like that.

We used marbling inks to create egg made ducklings by printing shapes, handprints and put them together using a split pin, so it looked like the chick is hatching. We worked together to make a fantastic nest using natural materials to putt the Chicks in too.



In Maths, we investigated number 6 in many ways. We all made 6 using a Variety of maths apparatus. We used ducks to explore subtraction. We learnt that cubes and cuboids have six flat surfaces and found some in the

> environment. We used cubes for printing, making pictures with squares.









In **Phonics** we have continued working on segmenting words into letter sounds by listening and played games to develop these skills. We have also continued to practise making pure sounds at the beginning of words.

The **Nursery** Children have also made super playdough ducklings and used feathers to decorate them.

Nursery

Sing 5 little ducks went swimming one day. Use pictures of chicks to help you. Take one away each time and say how many are left.

Reception

Use an egg box and six of two types of objects, e.g. eggs, conkers, marbles or acorns. Put different amounts of the objects and make an addition sum. E.g. 4 conkers plus 2 eggs makes 6 altogether. Have a go at writing the numbers.
