With old age comes wisdom, and this old owl was wise too. So he smiled and said,


"It is too early to say which one of us is lucky."





Successful learners have good strategic awareness. This means they:

Know which level of challenge to choose.

Know what resources they are going to need in order to complete the task.

Think about their learning and how they are going to go about it.

Usually have a fair idea about how long something is going to take them to do.

Can talk about themselves as a learner and talk about the process of learning.

Can see how what they are learning now fits into their wider learning.

Have a good understanding of their

chances of being successful.


Are able to plan ahead.

The opposite of strategic awareness is being 'robotic'. Robots can't think for themselves. They have to be told exactly what do to.




