We have had a very busy week in Waveney Class. The Children have settled in to the Class and have been playing well with their new friends.

Two Little Dickie Birds

Two little dickie birds Sitting on a wall. One named Peter, One named Paul.

Fly away Peter, Fly away Paul, Come back Peter, Come back Paul.



Our rhyme this week was **Two Little Dickie Birds.** The children have learnt the rhyme with the actions. We talked about what Peter and Paul might see if they were flying over a farm, a forest, the seaside, a cold place.

We have learnt all about number 2 in a wider context. We discussed units of measure - 2 grams, 2 kilos, 2 litres, 2 metres and 2 centimetres. We looked at 2p and f2 and talked about 1p+1p=2p. We looked at cones because they have 2 surfaces (one flat and one curved).



In phonics, Reception have been using the book Nature Shapes to work on sounds, blending and segmenting. We also played listening games and Silly Soup, in which we could only add items

beginning with the 'p' sound to our soup.

We talked about and drew horizontal and vertical lines and used the lines to draw walls. We also used building blocks to build walls and other constructions. Rosa and Polly worked together to Create a super playground, and Harry and George built a fantastic Castle.

We looked Carefully at the picture 'Landscape With Yellow Birds' by Paul Klee and used coloured Chalks to recreate our own. Everyone did a brilliant job! Here are a few of them...









We also made feathery birds and painted using feathers instead of brushes.

We have started the Baseline Assessment of Literacy and Maths with the Reception children that every we are required to do this half term.

The Nursery Children have also had fun, playing imaginatively in the home corner, riding balance bikes, exploring water and sand. They have enjoyed listening to stories too. Some of them have even had a go at dangling from the monkey bars!
