We have had a very busy week in Waveney Class, doing lots of lovely things.


Baa, Baa Black Sheep

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Our rhyme this week was **Baa Baa Black Sheep**. Reception also learnt a verse about a pink sheep from the book on the right. He was pink because his fleece had been shorn off. We looked at pictures of how the fleece becomes wool, then we sorted pictures according to whether they were made from wool. Some children gave good reasons why the clothes are made from wool. Lorelai said, "They're nice and warm for the winter." Walter said, "They're good to wear if it's windy 'cause if you don't wear them, you'll get cold." Verity said, "They are fluffy because if they're hard they won't feel nice."




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

We have learnt all about number 3 in a wider context. We discussed units of measure - 3 kilos, 3 litres, 3 metres and 3 centimetres. We talked about addition and subtraction stories of 3 (using objects, fingers and measurements). We looked at cylinders because they have 3 surfaces (two flat circles and one curved).

In phonics, Reception have continued to focus on blending and segmenting. It would be helpful if you could support this by giving instructions in robot talk, e.g. put on your h-a-t. Remember to use pure sounds. You can listen to them here:-

We talked about the characters in Baa Baa Black Sheep, and thought of other nursery rhymes characters. Some children even had a go at writing the characters' names.





We also made pictures of woolly sheep.

The Nursery children have been learning rhymes and the days of the week song. They made lovely fluffy sheep pictures, using paper, cotton wool, glue, googly eyes and paint. They played with number fish in the water, the Peppa Pig mini-world toys, the garage with cars and the farm. They also played with large foam 2D shapes. They also compared some very long sticks that they found outside.
