



Friday 14th October

What a busy week we have had in Waveney Class. We had two focus nursery rhymes this week, This Little Piggy and 5 Currant Buns in a Baker's Shop. We talked about what you might see on the way to market and the Children made road signs. We talked about what you can buy in a baker's shop and the Reception Children drew items and said the initial letter sound of the things they had drawn, and some of them used their phonics knowledge to have a go at writing the words. We had fun making and icing their buns. We hope they tasted yummy!



On Friday the whole school celebrated Black History Month. In Reception we looked at artwork by Faith Ringgold and read the story Tar Beach. We were inspired to create our own pictures in Faith's style using felt tipped pens to draw and collage to create a patchwork border.













We have learnt about number 5 in a range of contexts. We talked about addition and subtraction stories of 4 using fingers and objects. We counted out 5 pennies and learnt that they have the same value as a 5p piece, then we counted 5 £1 coins and learnt that they have the same value as a £5 note. We looked at and felt a square based pyramid and a triangular prism because they have 5 surfaces, and compared the differences between them.

In phonics, Reception have continued to focus on blending, segmenting and rhymes. The Nursery Children have been listening to sounds made by different objects in shakers, and discriminating between them.

In PSHE we talked about what makes us frightened, that it is okay to be frightened and how we can be brave.

The Nursery Children have also been singing 5 Currant Buns each day and had fun making buns too! They have been making the home corner into a party house, making bunting and using the large glittery shapes to make a sparkly floor. They painted using spaghetti, which was great fun!
