Well done Librarians!

Excitingly, the books bought include a huge selection of fantastic stories featuring culturally diverse heroes, such as Pink is for Boys, the Girl with Two Dads, Isaac and his Amazing Aspergers Superpowers, and All Are Welcome. This is in response to the work the librarians did with Mrs Hare to identify inclusive books to include on the Essential Guides.
