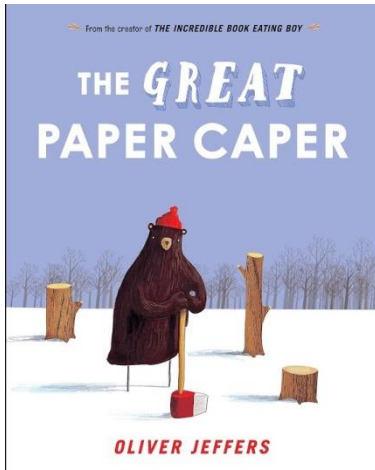
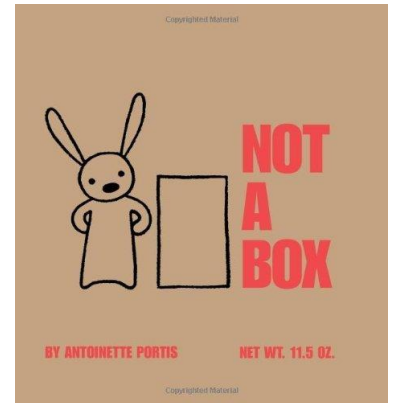


Peek at the Week

Friday 16th June



What a busy week in Waveney Class. Continuing our learning about Materials, this week's theme has been 'paper and card'. Our focus books were 'The Great Paper Caper' by Oliver Jeffers, and 'Not a Box' by Antoinette Portis. We learnt that a long time ago people did not have paper, so they wrote on animal skins or used rag or bamboo to make things to write on. We wrote about all the things a



box can be used for. We designed a model using boxes, then made them. We also made pictures using coloured paper strips – we folded or twisted the strips then stuck them on. We also folded paper to make paper planes and had fun flying them outside.

Rosa made a camera.



Seb made a car.



We also listened to the stories 'My Dad is Brilliant' by Nick Butterworth, and 'School For Dads' by Adam and Charlotte Guillain and Ada Grey. We talked about all the things that our dads can do. Raven told us that her dad makes delicious curry. Ada told us about the pasta her dad makes. We also learnt that lots of dads play the guitar, trumpet and the drums. The children have made Fathers' Day cards with a picture of something that their dad really likes and some wrote about what their dads can do. What a lot of talented dads!

In PSED, we talked about what makes our world wonderful and how we can care for it. We are very good at recycling paper that we don't need. Finley told us "Our scrap paper doesn't get wasted" and Wally said "It gets made into new paper".

In Phonics, one group has started to learn the trigraph **igh**. The other group is revising all Phase 3 phonemes, particularly focussing on writing words containing the digraphs and trigraphs so that we will be confident to use them in our independent writing.

In PSHE we talked about using 'please' and 'thank you' and why it is important to have good manners. We sang a 'Please and thank you' song and did some actions.

The Nursery children have enjoyed playing with the new children and having fun together. They have been riding the balance bikes, making a pretend car wash and have made lovely seaside pictures by drawing round templates and adding other features. Well done, children.
