



Friday 29<sup>th</sup> September

What a fantastic week we've had in Waveney class! This week, we have been using Little Red Riding Hood as our focus story. We listened to the story and talked about what happened. We described the wolf dressed as Granny in the book. We had a visit from Granny who showed us what Little Red Riding Hood took her and then we talked about other things to take to Granny, and we drew and annotated a

list. We talked about the wolf's character, and we wrote a class letter to The Big Bad Wolf.

We made mug cakes like the ones that Little Red Riding Hood took to Granny, however ours were huge! We made beautiful flowers for Granny to cheer her up and some of us also threaded wool through pasta tubes to make necklaces.



In Maths this week we have learnt all about the number 3 in a wider context. We found lots of different ways to represent the number 3, for example, 3 Multilink, 3 Numicon, and 3 star-jumps. We learnt addition and subtraction linked to the number 3. We discussed units of measure such as 3 o'clock, 3 centimetres and 3 metres. We also learnt about triangles and their 3 sides, and about cylinders having three surfaces.

In PSHE we talked about things that make us happy.

In phonics, we have been focussing on hearing and saying the initial letter sound of words and mark making, or copying the letter to write the sound. We have also been playing rhyming games.

The Nursery children have been creating Little Red Riding Hood's basket filled with delicious fruit. They wove paper across the basket and printed with real fruit. They look amazing!
