WILDER SCHOOLS

We're really excited to be teaming up with the Suffolk Wildlife Trust to take part in the Wilder Schools project. Over the course of the year, the children in Colorado Class will be working closely with Lauren Mack, a project worker at SWT, to assess our school grounds then plan ways in which they can be made more wildlife-friendly.

The project will consist of 9 project days delivered by Mrs Mack over the course of the year. It started this morning with a really engaging assembly about wildlife in Suffolk. Children from across the school have been encouraged to share their ideas for improvements either by talking to the Eco Committee or to the School Council. It will be wonderful for the children to explore the changing seasons and to monitor the impact of their improvements on the wildlife living in our school grounds.
