




## Peek at the Week

## Friday 8th November




Our last story on our toys theme last week was 'The Paper Dolls' by Julia Donaldson. We made and decorated concertina dolls and

dolls with moving body parts using card and split pins. The Reception children wrote cvc words on doll chains and found all the action words in the story.

This week we listened to the story of the first Christmas and talked about why there are angels, shepherds, wise men, Mary and Joseph

and baby Jesus in our Nativity play. We have been joining in with lots of Christmas themed activities and have enjoyed lots of Christmas stories. We have made and written in Cards. We wrote letters to Santa, using the Phonics skills we have been learning this term. We

In Maths, we have continued to consolidate number values within 10. We shared out amounts between 2 people – some children worked out that you cannot share 5 because the amounts are not the same. "There's one spare," said Eva. We also measured pictures of Santa's elves to find two that added up to 10cms.

In **Phonics** we have continued with Phase 2, learning to recognise the phonemes that the graphemes h b f ff I II make, and reading and writing CVC words containing these sounds.

In Forest School we used the hammock, climbed trees, finished planting the hedge around our tool area, played hide and seek, and played in the mud kitchen and digging area.
